Updates

Renovations are currently finished on the 8.9 M project to expand Hansen Hall of Sciences and will open in fall of 2019. Progress is still underway on Brodahl Building, which houses our well-known Communication Sciences and Disorders (CSD) program and clinic. Updates

Butler will begin accepting self-reported scores for the Fall 2021 admission cycle. Self-reported scores will be accepted via the application for admission and/or by the student completing a form on their status page. Official scores will be required for deposited students by July 1. The University will continue to accept complete scores from the high school transcript or from the testing service as official.
